York Creek community on Lemann Road. It is the place where some of our oldest ancestors rest, James and Jane Crayton Sr. Various other family members are also buried there. James Crayton Sr., was born April 16, 1854 in Caldwell County to his father and master, John Crayton.

As an adult, James united with Jane Bell Allen, born March 11, 1857, and together they bore 18 children. The story is told that there were nine boys and nine girls. Among the known children, were Jim Jr., Lizzie, Minnie, Gurtie, Rhoda, Tennessee, Dock, John, Ben,


Bruce, and Baylor. James and Jane can be honored in the fact that they are the Great-Grandparents of all living family today.

In respect of family origins, it would appear that their burial site be well preserved. However, the grass is badly grown up and the tombstones and graves have began to sink as a sign of neglect.
